ANAESTHETIC TECHNICIAN

Salary range: CI\$49,800 - CI\$66,984 per annum

The Anaesthetic Technician works in close cooperation with the Operating Theatre staff and provides clinical and technical support to the Anaesthetists at the Health Services Authority. The successful candidate develops an appreciation of the preferred needs of the Anaesthetists being assisted and to liaise between patients and surgeons.

Primary Responsibilities: The successful candidate assists with induction, maintenance, and emergence of anaesthesia inclusive of perioperative emergencies, peri arrest, cardiorespiratory arrest situations requiring Basic Life Support (BLS) skills, mental and physical support for the patient including positioning and transfer. The candidate checks and conducts routine maintenance on anaesthetic machines, anaesthetic gas delivery, ventilators, monitors humidifiers resuscitation equipment. He/she cleans and ensures decontamination and sterilization processes of all anesthetic and ancillary equipment are maintained. The candidate also accurately records routine equipment inspections including stocking and preparation of anaesthetic equipment rooms and procedural lockers.

Qualification & Experience: The successful candidate must possess a Diploma or Certificate in Anaesthetic Technology from an approved institution (American Society of Anaesthesia Technologists and Technicians certifications or equivalent). Must have at least two (2) years post qualification relevant and specialised anaesthetist technology experience. The candidate must also possess a Basic Life Support (BLS) certification. Must have excellent communications skills and the ability to work without close supervision.

A remuneration and benefits package, commensurate with experience and qualifications will be offered to the successful candidate.

Background Information

The Cayman Islands Health Services Authority ("HSA") provides and administers health care services and public health functions for residents of the Cayman Islands in accordance with the National Strategic Plan for Health.

Services are delivered primarily through the 124-beds at the Cayman Islands Hospital (the country's principal health care facility), and the 18-beds at the Faith Hospital on Cayman Brac. Ancillary services are offered at district health centres, and clinics for dental and ophthalmologic care. Residents of Little Cayman can access care through the island's clinic which is a purpose-built facility.

Job Purpose

To provide clinical and technical support to Health Service Authority Anaesthetists. To develop an appreciation of the preferred needs of the Anaesthetists being assisted and to liaise between patients and surgeon.

Dimensions

The postholder does not supervise any staff.

The postholder has no budgetary responsibility.

To work in close co-operation with Operating Theatre staff, particularly the Head of Anaesthesia. The postholder is required to be on-call when necessary to assist Health Service Authority Anesthetists.

The postholder has no budgetary responsibilities.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. To provide a high standard of clinical assistance to all areas, in George Town Hospital, where anaesthesia is administered.
 - a) Assistance with induction, maintenance, and emergence of anaesthesia.
 - b) Assistance with perioperative emergencies; peri arrest, cardiorespiratory arrest situations requiring Basic Life Support Skills
 - c) Providing mental and physical support for the patient including assistance in positioning and transfer.
 - d) Checking and preparation of anaesthetic machines and ancillary equipment.
 - e) Preparation and establishment of monitoring equipment with continued assistance in its operation where appropriate.
 - f) Preparation of intravenous administration equipment.


- g) Stocking and preparation of anaesthetic equipment rooms and procedural lockers.
- h) Cleaning and ensuring decontamination and sterilization processes of all anaesthetic and ancillary equipment.
- i) To participate in Department of Anaesthesia committees as appropriate.
- j) To maintain a high level of professional conduct and appearance at all times.
- k) To actively promote own self-development and to maintain own clinical practice to a high standard.

Qualifications, Experience & Skills Requirement

Practitioners who hold a diploma or certificate in Anaesthetic Technology from an approved institution (ASATT {American Society of Anesthesia Technologists and Technicians} certification or equivalent) and have at least 2 years post-qualification relevant and specialized anaesthetic technology experience.
