Background Information

The Cayman Islands Health Services Authority (“HSA”) provides and administers health care services and public health functions for residents of the Cayman Islands in accordance with the National Strategic Plan for Health.

Services are delivered primarily through the 136-beds at the Cayman Islands Hospital (the country’s principal health care facility), and the 18-beds at the Faith Hospital on Cayman Brac. Ancillary services are offered at district health centres, and clinics for dental and ophthalmologic care. Residents of Little Cayman can access care through the island’s clinic which is a purpose-built facility.

Job purpose

To provide a quality patient centered neurosurgical service at the Cayman Islands Hospital, Grand Cayman, Shared with Registrars and Clinical Interns rotating throughout the H.S.A.

Work is generated by patients referred by other consultants and the Accident and Emergency Departments. Patients transferred from General Practice Clinics. Patients referred from private practitioners.

Post holder is expected to refer patients to other disciplines within the government health service, or to tertiary center, where this is indicated by the clinical needs of the patients.

Liaise closely with colleagues in other clinical disciplines.

Dimensions

The principal specialties are provided by the C.I. Health Service Authority. Those requiring tertiary referral to Miami include specialized neurosurgery, specialist pediatric surgery, thoracic and vascular surgery, with some requiring air ambulance transfer. The 8 CCU beds, enable more critically ill patients to be retained on the island.

There are two trauma resuscitation rooms in the Accident & Emergency Department.

Postholder has no budgetary responsibilities

Duties and responsibilities

To provide a 24 hour neurosurgical service in conjunction with the other consultant surgeon on a rotation basis.

To provide regular neurosurgical out patient clinics and ward rounds on an agreed basis.

To provide back up for the accident and emergency medical staff

To manage medical patients in the Critical Care Unit involving where appropriate, and working closely with, colleagues in other disciplines

To run outpatient clinics at Faith Hospital (on our sister island Cayman Brac) on an agreed basis

To develop, along with colleagues in the Cayman Islands Hospital, evidence-based guidelines and care pathways relevant to the neurosurgical service.

To take part in continuing professional development, clinical audit and quality monitoring. There is an entitlement of 10days paid study leave per 2 year contract.

To participate in strategic healthcare planning of surgical services. The post holder will be a member of the Medical Staff Committee, Clinical Quality Committee, and Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee.

To establish, with colleagues, an ongoing education programme for nursing and other staff within the department.

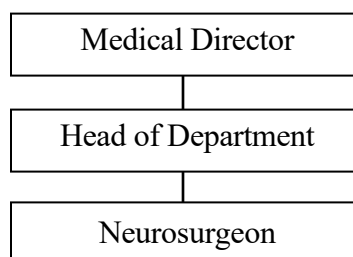
To liaise with other statutory and non-statutory agencies to develop health promotion and disease prevention strategies.

Qualifications, Experience & Skills Requirement

Must have a primary medical qualification registered in either Canada, the U.S.A., the United Kingdom, or Jamaica, and a minimum of four years training in neurosurgery as well as a recognized post-graduate qualification e.g. FRCS, MD, Board Certification or equivalent.

At least 7 years postgraduate experience in the specialty relevant to the services provided.

Reporting Relationship



Direct reports

Reports to the Clinical Head of Department.

Postholder may be involved in the supervision and training of returning Caymanian Doctors who are employed in the Department.

Ensuring adequate exposure to neurosurgical cases and how to deliver evidence base care for interns who rotate through the department.

Postholder guides the nursing staff in the care of the neurosurgical patients.
