REGISTERED NURSE - PERIOPERATIVE

The Registered Nurse works out of Specialist Clinic to provide support for surgical services and improve the perioperative workflow process and surgical experience for patients.

Primary Responsibilities: The successful candidate must be able to manage a caseload and provide care coordination with the surgical team throughout the patient's perioperative journey. Be aware of the patient's progress throughout the perioperative progress. Ensure perioperative tests are ordered, completed, and reviewed, identifying any potential risks that may delay or reschedule the surgical procedure. Initiate and manage the reserve waiting list effectively. Initiate and develop a preoperative one-stop approach clinic. Provide preoperative education to patients and families, documenting their understanding. Plan and contribute to the learning experience of nursing students.

Qualifications & Experience: The successful candidate <u>must</u> hold a Bachelor of Science in Nursing with a minimum of three (3) years of experience. Perioperative nursing experience is preferred. All candidates <u>must</u> be registered in either of the following jurisdictions to be eligible to practice in the Cayman Islands; Jamaica, USA, UK, Canada, South Africa, New Zealand and/or Australia. The candidates must demonstrate the ability to work in a multicultural environment.

A remuneration and benefit package, commensurate with experience and qualifications will be offered to the successful candidates of these post.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Cayman Islands Health Services Authority ("HSA") provides and administers health care services and public health functions for residents of the Cayman Islands in accordance with the National Strategic Plan for Health.

Services are delivered primarily through the 127 beds at the Cayman Islands Hospital (the country's principal health care facility), and the 18 beds at the Faith Hospital on Cayman Brac. Ancillary services are offered at district health centers, and clinics for dental and ophthalmologic care. Residents of Little Cayman can access care through the island's clinic, which is a purpose-built facility.

JOB PURPOSE

- To provide support for surgical services and improve the perioperative workflow process and surgical experience for patients.
- To reduce or eliminate operating theatre cancellations by managing the perioperative workflow efficiently.
- To improve patient experience and clinical outcomes.

DIMENSIONS

- Post holder has no budgetary responsibility but is a steward of the budget for the unit assigned
- Post holder directly supervises the Registered Nursing Assistant and the Healthcare Aide.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTABILITIES

- a. Manage caseload by providing care coordination with the surgical team throughout the patient perioperative journey.
- b. Act as liaison between the patient, surgical and operating team, and PFS and other services to optimize the surgical experience for patients.
- c. Maintain knowledge and awareness of where the patient's progress is throughout the perioperative process.
- d. Perform assessments, monitor, and report any changes in patient status that may affect patient surgical procedures to the relevant clinicians.

- e. Ensure perioperative relevant diagnostic tests are ordered, completed and results are reviewed. Identify and alert the clinical team of any potential risks, or other factors that may become known that may affect the delay or rescheduling of the surgical procedure.
- f. Educate patients and their families preoperatively after review by Physicians, validates and document their understanding of teaching.
- g. Actively strive to develop a preoperative one-stop approach clinic to perform preoperative surgical assessment.
- h. Maintain accurate documentation and records of patient progress throughout the surgical workflow from the time patient has consented for surgery, surgical completion to 48 hours post-surgery.
- i. Initiate follow-up calls within 24-48 hours post-surgical discharge and document the same.
- Actively maintain and constantly update the reserve waiting list to ensure full operating theatre utilization. Liaise and communicate with Clinicians and operating theatre all changes effectively.
- k. Advocates for patient safety and well-being throughout the perioperative process.
- I. Maintain accreditation (JCI) standards by reviewing and ensuring history and physical are within 30 days of the surgery date. Schedule the patient for reassessment in a timely manner before the scheduled surgery date if the patient does not meet the criteria.
- m. Participate in clinical auditing and produce reports as requested.
- n. Plan and contribute to the learning experience of nursing students.
- o. Direct or supervise less-skilled nursing or healthcare personnel and assign patients based on competence and scope of practice.
- p. Administer medication through various routes within the scope of practice while adhering to established standards and protocols.

- Be proficient in the use of equipment utilized in the department.
- Regularly review policies and procedures in the service
