- Chest pain
- Shortness of breath
- Severe asthma
- Severe burns

- Loss of consciousness
- Head trauma
- Suspected broken bone
- High fever/seizure in an infant or child
- Threat to life, limb or sight

## Urgent Care Walk-in Clinic

For non-life-threatening conditions, minor illness and injuries that require medical attention and need same-day evaluation

- Cold and flu symptoms
- Sore throat
- Minor sprains and strain
- Minor cuts that require stitches
- Fractures
- Ear pain
- Pink eye
- Vomiting and diarrhea
- Fever and rash
- Joint and back pains
- Bladder infections and UTIs
